## NOVEMBER IS ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH



The Alzheimer's Association estimates that 10 million baby boomers will develop Alzheimer's disease in the United States. Today, as many as 5.2 million Americans are living with Alzheimer's disease, which includes between 200,000 and 500,000 people under age 65 with young-onset Alzheimer's disease or other dementias.

Experts predict that by 2010, there will be almost a half-million new cases of Alzheimer's disease each year, and by 2050, there will be almost a million new cases each year.

Every 71 seconds, someone in America develops Alzheimer's disease; by mid-century someone will develop Alzheimer's every 33 seconds.

In September, the Alzheimer's Association held its annual Memory Walk. Concord Park's Compass Memory Support Director **Mary Baum** was able to raise \$1,110 to benefit the Alzheimer's Association from Forget-Me-Not sales and through the generous donation of sponsors.
