RESIDENT PROFILE



Louise Portais was born in North Cambridge. Her parents were born on Saint Pierre and Miquelon, a small group of islands that belong to France, located 126 miles off the coast of Nova Scotia. She traveled to these islands with her parents in 1946, taking an old freighter for \$15 a head. Louise attended school at Our Lady of Pity, the "French parish" in Cambridge.

Louise is bilingual, and as a young girl would play Scrabble with her parents in French. She attended Cambridge Latin School and graduated with honors, winning the Commercial prize at graduation.

While still in high school, Louise was hired at a copper boiler company located in Kendall Square, where she worked for 17 years. Louise later had several jobs working as an executive secretary to presidents and vice presidents of various companies. Louise's last position was working
