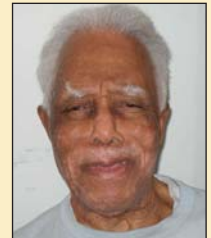

David Walcott was born in Cambridge and attended Cambridge Public Schools. After graduating from Rindge Technical High School in 1942, he went to work for G.W. Greer Company making war products. On March 8, 1944, David went into the Army Air Force. Eventually, he was sent to Keesler Field in Mississippi to train as an aircraft mechanic and was assigned to the 477th Bombardment Group.

After the war, David went back to Greer for a year. The physician father of his future wife, Phyllis Barrow of Somerville, encouraged David to become a pharmacist.
