Bring your sweetheart to enjoy Jeff Thomas and his Valentine's Day program at 10:00 A.M. *Public is welcome!*

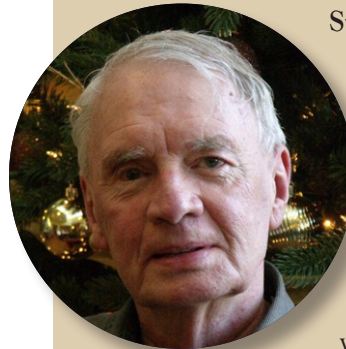
#### WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 22

Stanley was the principal architect on the project that turned the Prince Building on the Boston Waterfront from a commercial to a residential property. Stanley is also very interested and knowledgeable when it comes to cars, foreign and domestic. He is so informed that he essentially led the tour for us on a recent visit to the Larz Anderson Car Museum in Brookline. The tour guide stepped back, and encouraged Stanley to

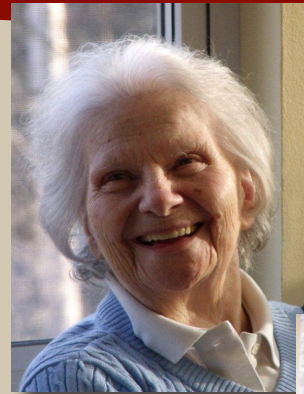
