RESIDENT PROFILE

In March of 1943, he was drafted into the Army and worked on the early radar aircraft warning systems in the Pacific Campaign. Jack was stationed on Iwo Jima during and after the U.S. invasion and witnessed the infamous raising of the U.S. flag on Mount Suribachi. Discharged in February of 1946, he attended Cleveland State, and became a savings and loan officer. Jack was a member of the Masons when he met his Rainbow Girl, Helen, at a dance. They were married for 56 years and had two children, Tom and Susan. Jack is very proud that both his children and all five of his grandchildren graduated from prestigious colleges. When Jack retired at age 60, he and Helen moved to Tampa, Florida where they golfed almost every other day! Jack says he is very comfortable at Nashoba Park and enjoys living here, near his son, Tom.
