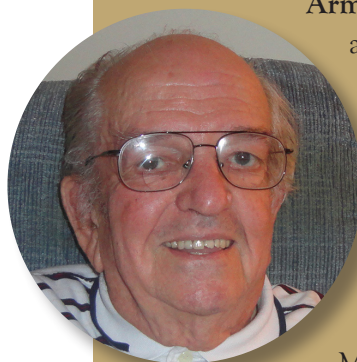

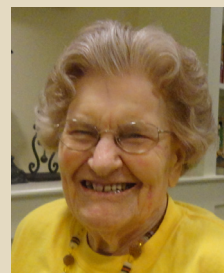
RESIDENT PROFILE
