RESIDENT PROFILE



Juliet Masters Sanger was born in England and raised in a small town 20 miles north of London named Welwyn Garden City. Her father was a journalist on an engineering paper and her mother had been a teacher. Juliet had two older brothers and enjoyed school and her carefree childhood until World War II began to threaten their lives. In August of 1940, Juliet was sent to live with an American family in Worcester. She traveled by ship with many other British children to stay safe during the war. Juliet wrote an account of this in 2002. When Juliet returned home to England, she finished her schooling at a small progressive school and then attended a teachers’ training college in London. She graduated in 1949 and taught elementary school for four years before going to work in London at the Royal Institute of British Architects.

In 1956, Juliet returned to the United States. She lived with a friend in New Jersey, and commuted to New York to work at the Architectural Record. She moved to Boston where she met her husband, Edward. They were married in 1960 and had two children, Duncan and Kate. Juliet now has two grandchildren, Audrey and Graham.

Juliet says she is most comfortable at Neville Place when she is visiting with her many friends and when she is painting her beautiful watercolors.
