They had three children: Alice, Dan, and Frank, but Anna's husband was a changed man after the war and he passed away very young.

Anna raised her children with some help from her mother and father. She worked at Lemuel Shattuck Hospital during the day and attended school at night, eventually receiving her degree in Social Services from Harvard University. Anna retired after working many years for the State of Massachusetts.

Anna says that she truly likes living at Neville Place, where she has been for almost seven years!
