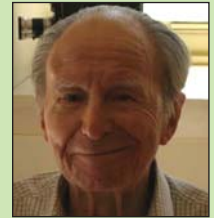

After the war, Howard continued his education and graduated with a degree in chemical engineering from the University of Michigan. About this time he married his high school sweetheart. They moved back to New Jersey, where he worked for General Foods as a chemical engineer. While working at General Foods, Howard became a patent attorney.



Howard lost his wife to cancer in 1948. Three years later, while still working for General Foods, Howard met a woman who was working there as
