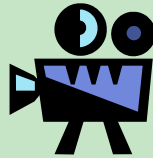

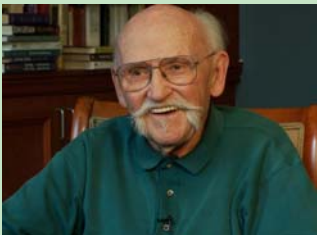
World War II Veterans' Interviews
