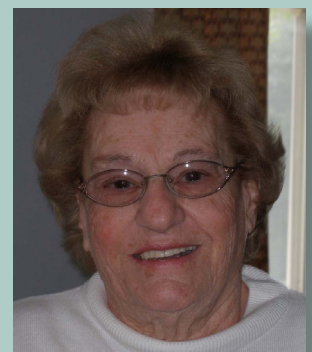
After retirement, Becky played sports and did a lot of walking. She participated in a 5K marathon, where she came in first place in the age 70-plus category.
