RESIDENT PROFILE

Don Hale was born in Oakfield, New York in 1931, on a family farm where he learned the value of hard work, and a sense of service. The family moved to Buffalo and Don enrolled in a mechanical high school. He went into the US Army in 1950 earning a certificate for meritorious achievement in 1953 when he jumped onto a driverless half-track and brought it to a stop, saving a lot of valuable property. The action earned him a commendation from his captain.

Don married Lorraine Carlo in 1956. They had five children: Don, Doug, Dave, Greg, and Kaye. In the early 1960s Don started working on Clark Lift Trucks, and in 1974 he opened his own business providing lift truck parts, casters, and wheels. His son Don now runs that business; Doug is a retired transplant surgeon; Dave is a retired Air Force colonel, Greg is an associate dean of organic chemistry at the University of Texas, and Kaye is a critical care physician. Don says their success is due to Lorraine. Lorraine says 90% of their success is from Don. They are both correct!

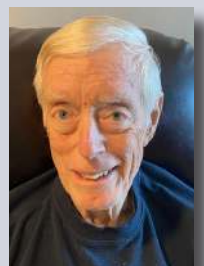
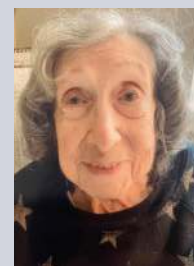

Our Roaring 20s party was a roaring success, with a live band, great food, and a signature Prohibition-era cocktail called a Mary Pickford!



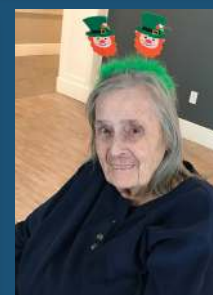
