KENNETH GILLPATRICK WE ARE VETERANS

MOST POPULAR MEN'S PROGRAMS: History lectures, current events & exercise classes

WWII Experiences: Kenneth operated one of the gliders that flew into Normandy on D-Day, infamously known as "flying coffins". 17,000 pilots died, but Kenneth miraculously survived and even stayed behind to help an injured comrade. **A 1941 Brockton High graduate,** Kenneth Gillpatrick is an extremely hardworking, humble and patriotic individual. He fought in WWII and his experiences, which include flying into Normandy on a glider on D-Day and being one of the first to occupy Berlin, are extraordinary.

Following the War, Kenneth served on the Brockton Fire Department, eventually as Deputy Chief. Although he was involved in a dangerous gas explosion, after which most of the department retired, he remained working until his 65th birthday.

In addition to reflecting on past military experiences with fellow veterans at Heights, Kenneth also enjoys the local connections and friendships he has

with residents and their families, some of whom were firefighters alongside him.

Today, Kenneth enjoys twice-daily visits from his son, once to bring his morning newspaper and again in the afternoon just to sit and talk.

Due to her unique experience, Joyce was featured in the documentary *Six Locked Doors* and countless news stories.

Joyce has had an eclectic professional career holding jobs at various well-known local companies including Boston University, Lord & Taylor and Mass General Hospital. She is also an accomplished writer and natural born leader, but her real pride and joy comes from her family, which includes five greatgrandchildren!
